Bachelor of Arts in Music Course Sequence Guide

Note that full-time enrollment requires a minimum of three course units (twelve credits) per semester, but no more than 4.5 units (eighteen credits) without permission (consult your advisor).

Year 1 B.A. in Music majors must pass the Keyboard Proficiency Exam in order to graduate. If a student has a background in piano and believes they can pass the proficiency without taking Keyboard Skills classes, they should take the Keyboard Proficiency Exam at the end of the fall semester of Year 1. If a student needs to take Keyboard Skills I and II, which cannot be taken until after passing "Musicianship I," they are encouraged to do so in the spring semester of Year 1 and the fall semester of Year 2, respectively, and to take the Keyboard Proficiency Exam at the end of the fall semester of Year 2 in preparation for the Sophomore Review. Your advisor will make precise recommendations for keyboard study based on an individual student's degree plan(s).
